


**The Fourth Sunday after the Epiphany

A Reading from Paul's first letter to the Corinthians

1 Corinthians 12:12-20, 25-27

For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free—and we were all made to drink of one Spirit.

Indeed, the body does not consist of one member but of many. If the foot would say, "Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body," that would not make it any less a part of the body. And if the ear would say, "Because I am not an eye, I do not belong to the body," that would not make it any less a part of the body. If the whole body were an eye, where would the hearing be? If the whole body were hearing, where would the sense of smell be? But as it is, God arranged the members in the body, each one of them, as he chose. If all were a single member, where would the body be? As it is, there are many members yet one body. But God has so arranged the body, that there may be no dissension within the body, but the members may have the same care

for one another. If one member suffers, all suffer together with it; if one member is honored, all rejoice together with it. Now you are the body of Christ and individually members of it.

The Holy Gospel

Matthew 4:12-23

Celebrant: The Holy Gospel of our Savior Jesus Christ according to Matthew.

All: **Glory to you, O Christ.**

When Jesus heard that John had been arrested, he withdrew to Galilee. From that time Jesus began to proclaim, “Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near.”

As he walked by the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon, who is called Peter, and Andrew his brother, casting a net into the sea—for they were fishermen. And he said to them, “Follow me, and I will make you fish for people.” Immediately they left their nets and followed him. As he went from there, he saw two other brothers, James son of Zebedee and his brother John, in the boat with their father Zebedee, mending their nets, and he called them. Immediately they left the boat and their father, and followed him.

Jesus went throughout Galilee, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom and curing every disease and every sickness among the people.

LEM: We pray for all who are coming to faith, all who wonder about faith, and all who are struggling with faith.

All: **Light of all creation, guide us to lead, teach and nurture your disciples.**

LEM: We pray for the world, especially where there is trouble and suffering, far away or nearby. We pray for areas of conflict and struggle, especially those we now name:

All: **Ember of steadfast care, fuel our passion to challenge injustice and violence and to pursue peace and reconciliation.**

LEM: We pray for those in need of food, shelter, clothing, and of God's healing touch, especially those for whom our prayers are especially desired: ***Charles, Edna, Sheila, DuSean, Lisa, Mary, Gabriel, Joan, Gwenn, Nancy, Patricia, Ola, Joe, Janet, Charles, Martha, Elizabeth, James, Vickie, Linda, Charlene, Christine, Jen, Betty, Liz and her family, and all facing exclusion or harm***, and those we now name [pause]. Comforter of the suffering,

All: **Warm our hands to loving service.**

LEM: We pray for those who have died, especially those we now name (*pause*) and for all who mourn.

All: **Light that shines in the darkness, welcome them into everlasting light, and grace us with glimmers of your presence.**

LEM: We pray for those who celebrate birthdays, anniversaries, and other accomplishments that we now name, silently or aloud, *especially Hush on his birthday* [*pause*]. We pray,

All: **Bright beam of your grace and truth, strengthen their trust in your goodness.**

LEM: We offer thanksgiving for answered prayers and for ways we have known God to be moving in our lives (*PLEASE share some of these aloud!*)

All: **God of sun and stars, thank you for the joys and wonders of daily life.**

LEM: God of radiant light, your love illuminates our hopes before we know them, and our needs before we ask. Kindle your flame within us, that in our prayers and service, we may know your transforming presence at work in the world around us. All this we ask through Jesus Christ, our Lord. **Amen.**

Confession of Sin

Celebrant: Let us confess our sins against God, our neighbors, and ourselves.

Silence.

All:

We have sinned in ignorance:

we have sinned through our own deliberate fault.
We are truly sorry.

Celebrant: The peace of Christ be always with you.




